

EASTER RESURRECTION Rolls



Ingredients

- Crescent roll dough
- Large marshmallows
- Melted butter
- Brown Sugar
- Cinnamon sugar mixture (optional)

Step 1: Preheat the Oven

Preheat your oven according to the instructions on the crescent roll dough package.

Step 2: Prepare the Ingredients

Open the crescent roll dough package and separate the individual triangles. Set aside.

Step 3: Explain the Symbolism

Before beginning, explain to the kids the symbolism behind the resurrection rolls. Tell them that the marshmallow represents Jesus, who was laid in the tomb, and the crescent roll represents the tomb itself.

Step 4: Roll the Marshmallows

Give each child a marshmallow and have them roll it in melted butter before rolling it in the brown sugar. This represents the anointing of Jesus' body before burial.

Step 5: Wrap the Marshmallows

Place each brown sugar + butter-coated marshmallow in the center of a crescent roll triangle. Wrap the dough around the marshmallow, sealing it tightly. Explain that this represents Jesus being wrapped in burial cloths and laid in the tomb.

Step 6: Bake the Rolls

Place the wrapped marshmallows on a baking sheet and bake them in the preheated oven according to the instructions on the crescent roll dough package. As the rolls bake, the marshmallows will melt, leaving the rolls hollow inside.

Step 7: Remove from Oven

Once the rolls are baked and golden brown, carefully remove them from the oven and let them cool for a few minutes.

Step 8: Explain the Resurrection

While the rolls are cooling, explain to the kids that just as the rolls are empty inside, the tomb where Jesus was buried became empty when He rose from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Step 9: Serve and Enjoy

Serve the resurrection rolls to the kids and enjoy them together as a delicious and meaningful treat. Optionally, you can sprinkle the rolls with a cinnamon sugar mixture before serving.

Step 10: Reflect and Discuss

Take a moment to reflect on the significance of the resurrection of Jesus and discuss what it means for us as Christians. Encourage the kids to share their thoughts and feelings about the Easter story.
